If the signature line appears on the last page of a document, the page number, "date" line, and at least one line from the body of the document should also appear on the last page.

Legal documents should always be double spaced.

Only capitalize the first letter of the first word in the close of a letter, i.e., Sincerely, Very truly yours, etc.

Standard rules for spacing:

- 1 space after a comma
- 1 space after a semi colon
- 2 spaces after a period
- 2 spaces after a colon
- No spaces before or after a dash
- No spaces before or after a hyphen
- No spaces between quotation marks and the matter enclosed
- 1 space after an exclamation mark used in the body of a sentence
- 1 space after a period following an abbreviation or an initial.
